Key points for creating a comic strip -:

 - · Dialogues should be in word-balloons/speech bubbles.
- · Your comic strip should not have more than 4 characters.



- 2. The maximum sugar intake of Rahul and Rakesh is 156 calories and 248 calories, respectively, in a day. Write the numbers individually in Roman numerals. Also, find the sum of total calories consumed by both of them and write the answer using Roman numerals.
- 3. In a city, the number of vegetarians are 256478, and the number of non-vegetarians are 149876.
 - a. Estimate the number of vegetarians to the nearest hundred, thousand and lakh.
 - b. Estimate the number of non-vegetarians to the nearest ten, ten thousand and lakh.
 - c. Find a rough and closer estimate of the difference in the number of vegetarians and non-vegetarians.
- 4. Cartoon Making (Interdisciplinary Activity with Fine Arts). Take an A-4 Size coloured sheet. Make cartoons of the first 10 whole numbers. Make according to these rules:
 - Colour Yellow Smallest Number

- A Colour Red Greatest Numbers
- ♣ Colour Blue Number Divisible by 2 and 3
- ♣ Colour Green First odd number
- ♣ Colour Pink Only even prime number
- 5. Tangram is a Geometrical Chinese puzzle cut in a square of seven pieces, which can be arranged to make various other shapes. Take old colourful pieces of paper and cut them in shape to form a tangram as shown in the sample.

Use these tangram pieces to form any one Yoga asana and paste it into your scrapbook.



6. Make vegetables and fruit bill including Cost per kg, Quantity purchased and Final cost. Make it for 5 days on 5 separate sheets.

Activity -2 : Sorting Method –

Visit a nearby departmental store or clothing store and observe how classification of materials is useful. Try to find out the basis of classification of different materials. Click photographs to show how different materials are arranged systematically. Paste those photographs and write your observations in a tabular form on an A4 size sheet.

OR

Activity -3: Separation Method –

Take your mother's help to identify 2 methods that can be used to separate mixtures at home. Can be in the kitchen: To sort out vegetables or in the garden to sort leaves, for sorting of clothes after washing etc.

Interview your mother and note methods used to separate things at home and make a report of methods of separation used at home. For two examples from different areas of the house take an indepth research project, use pictures, diagrams, web diagrams to complete your report.

Read Ch-1 and Ch-3 thoroughly from book and learn Question/Answers for PA-1.

Note- Do activity-1 and one activity of your choice from activity-2 or activity 3.
